Aims/priorities: Action Oldham Fund Small Grant (formerly known as Project) and Micro Grant (formerly known as Seed Corn) available now.

Priorities are:

- Helping to develop the skills and knowledge of Oldham residents to improve their quality of life and their ability to contribute to their community

Who can apply? This grant is open to Oldham based (or working within the borough) VCFSE groups that are members of Action Together CIO (becoming a member is simple

Grant amount: Organisations based or working within the Oldham Borough are invited to apply for the small grant (up to £10,000) or micro grant (up to £1,000).
